The 53rd Annual Meeting of the Ocular Microbiology and Immunology Group will be held at the **The Palace Hotel**, 2 New Montgomery Street, San Francisco CA, in the **Twin Peaks Room, Friday, October 11, 2019, from 7:30 am until 1:00 pm**, with registration at 6:45 am. The business luncheon meeting will follow in the **Pacific Heights Room**. The Federated Scientific Session (Cornea Society and EBAA) will also take place on Friday, October 11, 2019, at The Palace Hotel.

Darlene Miller, DHSc, MPH, Research Professor, Department of Ophthalmology, Department of Microbiology and Immunology, Technical Director Ocular Microbiology Laboratory, University of Miami-School of Medicine, Bascom Palmer Eye Institute/ABLEH, will present the 24th Thygeson Lecture, "*Acanthamoeba and Keratitis...More than meets the Eye.*" Jeremy Keenan, MD, 2018 Harry Hirsch Leiter Award Recipient, will give an encore presentation of his winning paper, "*In Vitro Synergy Testing of Commonly Used Anti-Amoebic Agents: Antagonism of Voriconazole*," to acknowledge the generous \$500.00 honorarium for the Hirsch Leiter recipient of best paper, which is open to all presenters. This year's program will include a one hour mini-symposium titled "Emerging Infections and Their Relationship to Eye Disease".

Meeting Dues/Registration and Business Luncheon

OMIG membership dues have remained steady for nearly ten years. Due to increasing costs to host the annual meeting as well as decreasing corporate support, it has become necessary to increase the annual dues. To cover the costs of putting the meeting together, the annual dues, which include meeting registration, will be \$95.00. A reduced membership rate of \$75 will be available for residents, fellows, or students. For those who register onsite at the meeting, the dues will be \$110.00. Held immediately following the annual meeting, the business luncheon cost will remain \$35.00 in addition to your dues, though lunch will be \$50.00 if purchased at the meeting. In additional, senior members are strongly encouraged to consider a minimal donation (\$5, \$10, or \$20) to help offset the cost of membership for young member. We ask that you consider sending nominations for Board members to <u>ocularmicrobiology@gmail.com</u>, in preparation for the elections held during the OMIG lunch and business meeting.

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Abstract Submission

For those interested in presenting, abstracts must be submitted by **August 9, 2019**, to <u>ocularmicrobiology@gmail.com</u>, in order to be considered for the meeting. Electronic version of the abstract is available on <u>http://eyemicrobiology.upmc.com/OMIG.htm</u>. The first author or sponsor must be a member in good standing and presenter must register for the meeting upon acceptance. A member can sponsor or present only one paper. **All papers will be 5 minutes in length with 2 minutes for discussion.** Acceptance or rejection notices will be e-mailed in early September to the e-mail address that accompanies your abstract.

PowerPoint presentations are required via email at least 10 days before the meeting date. The agenda and abstracts for recent meetings are available on the web site, as is all correspondence concerning the 2019 annual meeting. The agenda and abstracts for the papers to be presented at the 2019 meeting will be on the web site within four weeks of the meeting date.

Ocular microbiology and immunology is the core mission of OMIG. The Board requests that authors and presenters try to stress infectious agents, immunity, and inflammation as a response to foreign agents whether infectious or autoimmune responses with their submissions. Neoplasia is not considered part of the core mission at this time. In addition, the Board also requests that authors and presenters try to stress new data and statistical analysis in their submissions whenever possible.

Commercial Relationships Policy

The Board of OMIG has instituted a commercial relationships policy for authors and presenters. This policy is derived directly from the AAO policy for abstract submission to its annual meeting. The policy is enclosed and you are asked to provide a disclosure code at the bottom of the abstract box. The disclosure code is necessary for your abstract to be considered.

Scientific papers may be submitted for presentation at either the OMIG or Federated Cornea Society meetings to be held October 11. **However, the same paper may only be presented at one of these Friday meetings.**
